QUESTIONS YOU HAVE ASKED

Roger L. Leonard

Questions about James 5:14. (I'm adding v. 15.)

James 5:14-15 (NASB) Is anyone among you sick? Then he must call for the elders of the church and they are to pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord; 15 and the prayer offered in faith will restore the one who is sick, and the Lord will raise him up, and if he has committed sins, they will be forgiven him.

The questions: Was this done outside the church assembly? When was this practice discontinued? Was it written after the Gentiles became Christians? Was it in reference to Matt. 9:2-6? (Linda Hester.)

Answers.

James was written about A.D. 40 to Jewish Christians. The historical setting is during the age of miracles, which affects the meaning of James 5:14, 15.

The context. Someone would have been so sick that they could not have been in the assembly, so the elders would be called upon to come to them.

What was to happen? The elders were to come and

1) pray a "prayer of faith" over the infirm individual, which would cause the sick one to be raised up (or "save him that is sick", ASV) by the Lord. The prayer of faith results from the faith of the praying elders. There was clearly promise of healing, not a mere possibility. This leads us to conclude that this was miraculous. We have an event in Mark 9:14-29, where the Lord rebuked His disciples due to a lack of faith and failure to pray to drive out a demon. So prayer and faith are critical. (The querist also asked if this related to Matt. 9:2-6. That text concerns proof of Jesus' divinity, and although very similar, providing both healing and forgiveness of sins, they are not quite the same. However, the results are the same.)

First century setting. There were members in the early church who possessed "gifts of healing" (1 Cor. 12:9). This was obviously the case with early church elders. Their "prayer of faith" in the power of God would cause the sick individual to be raised up, that is, fully healed. Now, does this same power exist today? No. We read in 1 Cor. 12:28-31; 13:8-13, and Eph. 4:11-16, where the Holy Spirit expressly taught that all of the miraculous gifts/powers were of limited duration and were to cease with the apostolic age. There were but two ways at that time to receive the power of the Holy Spirit: 1) The baptism of the Holy Spirit on the apostles (Acts 2:1-11; 5:12, 13), and 2) by the laying on of hands by the apostles (Acts 8:14 -18). Once the apostles died, no one else received miraculous gifts.

What about the anointing with oil? There are various explanations, but olive oil does contain medicinal properties. The Samaritan "came to [the injured man] and bandaged up his wounds, pouring oil and wine on them" (Luke 10:34). Some see the oil as symbolic of the elders' prayers. Regardless, the sick would have been miraculously healed by the Lord, apart from the oil.

Finally, forgiveness of one's sins may have been needed. Verse 16 teaches that confession is essential when forgiveness is required. Contextually, the confession would have been made public and forgiveness consequently granted. However, the Lord alone can ultimately forgive sins, not elders. (Isa. 43:25; Matt. 6:12; I John 1:9.)
